Executive summary of the Action

The project is strengthening of marginalized community for sustainable livelihood through rights & entitlements; Supported by BFTW and CASA has been implemented by Prayas Gramin Vikas Samiti (PGVS), Patna. The PGVS are working this project areas in the 15 villages of the Banma Itahari and Salkhua in Saharsa District of Bihar on Agriculture Labour, Sharecroppers, and Marginal Farmer and they are mostly belongs to Dalit Community. The PGVS work with total 7941 populations, (4523 male and 3418 female) in the of 02 blocks (Banma Itahari and Salkhua)

Activities perform

- Meeting on village and Panchayat Level :- Meeting held on village level in our intervention 15 project villages on the various issues of related to the community streangthening, rights & entitlements, sustainable livelihood etc. The village meeting with CBOs held 112 times, 4 times meeting on panchayat level also held on strengthening of CBO leaders, disaster, livlihood & participation in Gram Sabha, 49 times meeting with women watch group and 42 times meeting with Children group.
- Livelihood promotion:- A workshop held on Livelihood promotion planning on 17 october 2021 at Mahishi with district level forum members.
- Workshop on Gender Budgeting with Leadre and Youth:- The workshop held on 11 Novmber 2021 at Pramandaliy Pustkalay, Saharsa with youths and community leaders.
- Campaign for fruits plantation:-There are 510 fruit plants planted in 2 blocks of Saharsa district Banma Itahri & Salkhua. Also the community members benefitted with kitchen garden nutrition kit.

Executive summary of the Action

The Poverty Reduction and Food Security, Promoting Social Inclusion of Particularly Marginalized Groups and Increasing Resilience to Disasters in High-Risk Areas . The Project

work area is 15 villages of Sattar Kataiya block at Saharsa District. The Project area is approx 35 KM distance in form Saharsa District. Ten Gram Panchayats are selected from these 15 villages. The PGVS team were interact or discus in each villages for our Mission Vision regarding BMZ Globle project.

The PGVS team were discussing with SCs community regarding their issues, Village Development Plan, health and hygiene, Legal Documentation drive, Capacity building, Strengthening of CBO's and all government schemes.

The team members were social maping and Baseline surve completed in 15 villages at Sattar Kataiya Block of BMZ Globle Project Area.

The PGVS team also interacts PRI members and they also support them like Mukhiya, ward members and Panchayat samiti.And Govt. official's members for their supporting like Doctors,ANM,AWW,ASHA,VIKAS MITR, School Teachers Etc.

Activities perform

Improved access to government social benefits, increased self-help capacity, and increased interaction between civil society initiatives and government agencies will lead to more effective implementation of government development programs and increase the resilience of particularly marginalized populations to disasters, increase their food security, and promote joint implementation of government-mandated strategies for the social integration of marginalized minorities.

. All fifteen Villages community members(15000 person) are aware of Corona virus. They know its symptoms So follow the guide line of covid -19 like –wear a mask & sanitiser. They found maintaining physical distance.

2. Some community members (lumsam 7000 person) are achieved some government scheme like – ICDS service, Manrega, Indira Awas, PDS Card, S.S scheme etc.

3. Efforts will be made to improve the education level of 30 children from all 15 villages, there will be a total of 450 children who will be present in the school every day and through the project the problems being faced in the studies of the children will be solved

Food security (nutrition) has been improved by intensive targeting by means of improved access to government programmes.

As per our Base line survey our team observation there are Many SAM and MAM children in our project area. Buti have not actual number / data Available in this time. Because this project is starting phage and Even in the survey, the right answer could not be found.

The end of the project, actual number of SAM & MAM children's iscollected and all children are rehabilitated then suffering from malnutrition. And at the end of the project all the community members will also be linked to the government schemes.

Regular and reliable quality controls are carried out in the concerted state programme "Poshan Abhiyan" and in the "Public Distribution System" for comprehensive food security.

About 8000 (Eight thousand) community members participated in the Poshan Mela. The Mela included all village-based foods, green vegetables, fruits, milk and eggs. The sources available from all these food items were displayed through banners. and the properties of all the food items were explained orally. By which all the members of the community became aware.

In addition, campaigns to raise awareness about ways to improve food security at the community level, the village level public campaigns on the theme of social participation of minorities on national and international days such as World Children's Day, high-profile campaigns for children with members of child clubs and children's parliaments who

Control bodies, networks, self-help groups and citizens' initiatives (CBOs) acting at community and district level in terms of food security are strengthened.

In the initial phase, PGVS team did not meet any stakeholder at Meso level, but now PGVS team interacted with stakeholders at Meso level and also invited to some program like District level government employee in social audit training as a trainer. Participated in Dalit network meeting, Saharsa District President of Dalit AdhikarManch, District Secretary of Schedule Caste Tribal Cell, Self Help Groups etc.

The nutritional knowledge of particularly disadvantaged families has been improved by providing information on dietary and hygiene habits and government support services.

This year at least 80 pregnant and lactating women were told about cleanliness and Through a number of activities, the project is imparting knowledge and exercises on cleanliness, food diversification and preparation to the families living in the target community, especially pregnant women and mothers with malnourished children.

Through a range of activities, the project is imparting knowledge and exercises on cleanliness, food diversification and preparation to the families living in the target community, especially pregnant women and mothers with malnourished children! nutrition through the meeting and 9 women were connected to government services through their project.

CCFD- Terre Solidaire : - Improvement in Quality of Life of Migrant Labourers in Slums of Patna

Executive summary of the Action

The National Commission on Rural Labour in India (NCRL, 1991) estimates more than 10million circular migrants in the rural areas alone. These include an estimated 4.5 million interstate migrants and 6 million intra-state migrants. The Commission pointed out that there are large number of seasonally migrant workers in the agriculture and plantations, brick kilns, quarries, 9 construction sites and fish processing. The problem of seasonal migrant workers in the sugar industry and other agro-based industries is not a new phenomenon in India. There are more than 500 sugar factories in India.

Haryana state provides employment to a large number of migrant workers from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. Some workers migrate to Tea and coffee plantations in Karnataka states, West Bengal and Assam states employ migrant labourers from Tamilnadu, Andhra Pradesh and Bihar. Besides, and more than 12 lakh inter-state migrant workers work in the agricultural sector. Brick kilns provide temporary employment to around 10 lakh. (Source: Labour Rights and Labour Standards for Migrant Labour in India by Dr. W.N. SALVE)

The government said in the Loksabha on 22nd September, 2020 that Bihar accounted for 1.5 million -14.3% – of the 10.5 million migrant workers who returned to their home states during the period March to June. Scores of them died during the transition. This shows pathetic condition of migrant labourers in the state.

The intra state migration in Bihar is also present. Bihar is the least urbanized state in India. Most of the rural jobseekers come to Patna for menial jobs and end up in slums. Most of the slum dwellers have their native villages in north Bihar. They come here to pull rickshaws or physical labour at construction sites. Some of them are semi-skilled and paid too low to carry nothing more than the subsistence living

Activities perform

Task and Progress accomplished in month of February 2022:

In month of January, we have gone ahead in accomplishment of various tasks assigned in this project explained in following paragraphs -

Field Survey in slums:

The survey work continued in February.. This month we divided our team into two groups. Two Volunteers were given responsibility to continue the survey while one was given the task to do data entry along with field work.

In February we collected 600 samples in 6 slums of Patna- Gai Ghat, Begumpur, Guru ka Bagh, Digha Mushari, Jhakri Mahadev. We have also progressed in data entry work. Respondent's cooperation and availability of resource persons decide when and how long the survey can be performed. Apart from this other factors also play an important role in surveys like consent of ward members, etc. In some slums people show their disinterest in contributing to the survey. Even at some places they have complaints and misconceptions regarding the research work as well as for the NGOs. We hope March will be a more productive month for us as we will try to collect more data.

Survey form tabulated/entered in software:

As the survey is being conducted, we have decided that data entry of the data goes on simultaneously. This is being done to ensure that the analysis can be initiated as a handsome amount of data has been tabulated.

In the month of February, we have tabulated over 400 forms.

Training of Volunteers on methodologies and Challenges faced during Survey:

One training session was conducted this month. Volunteers were given feedback about their work in the month of February and issues being faced in the field were discussed.

Each member for the survey team was assigned 250 household surveys as target for the month of February and the team of rights and entitlements team was assigned to ensure 100 shram cards were made.

Cluster meetings held for awareness of Rights:

In February, while Visiting Slums / Basti like Kanhaiya Nagar, Prem Nagar, Chaili Tal, Digha Mushahri, Kaushal Nagar. Many PDS and government Schemes have been monitored and evaluated. There was a lack of information and relationship between communities and the government officials. Residents didn't know about the proper procedure for getting cards (E - Sharm, Ration, Health, APL, BPL, Antodhaya, Maandhan). We have prepared 100 E - Sharm Cards in the communities of Kanhaiya Nagar and Kaushal Nagar. When Communities start accepting you then you get space to initiate a dialogue on your terms. Public toilets are the main issue in many slums. There are established toilets by the government but due to lack of proper maintenance it has become useless. WIth coordination and community interaction, we have been able to establish propers resource persons in many slums, like Digha Mushahri, Digha Nahar Par, Ward No :- 31 of Danapur Municipality, Domkhana (Nagar Parishad ke Piche) Ward no :- 35, Jhakhari Mahadev, Ward No :- 21& 22 of Danapur Municipality. During our interaction in slums, we have also been creating awareness about Maandhan yojana of the central government.

Liasoning with Elected representative:

In order to initiate talks with the elected representative, people from our team (Sanjeev and Madhur) met with elected MLA of Phulwari Sharif Vidhan and briefed him about the project. The representative assured our team members of our help and asked us to remain in touch. He said, whatever help will be required in his constituency, he will extend it to us.

Voluntary Teaching Programme:

After the COVID cases started declining, we have resumed 3 teaching centres in Patna, 1 one in Bihar Sharif in Mid February. We are also glad to inform you that we have initiated a new teaching centre in Saadiq Meena Bazaar, which we are planning to convert into a resource centre.

We also want to inform you that we have not conducted any ability tests as the classes resumed in the mid of the month. We are planning to conduct the test by end of march

family are not even able to eat properly now. We don't even have land to do farming. Due to which the cash income is completely closed and vegetables are also very expensive in the market, due to which I and my family do not even eat green vegetables.

The vegetable seed (Nenua, Kadu, Seem, Bitter gourd, Kohra, Bhatua, Cucumber etc.) given by the organization Prayas and Caritas, which can be planted at our living place even without land, after the coming three months, these vegetables Me and my family can all eat!

We have 3 sons and three daughters. Everyone got married. We suffer a lot after the death of our husband.

The daughter-in-law does not give the food, she abuses more than the food she gives. our son kills too. Now a rainy day. The house is full of



water. Waking up at night due to rain, he spends the night by covering himself with foil. The daughter-in-law gives food while working in the field. The food is very less, it is not even filling the stomach. We have become old, the body does not work, we remain ill, the disease has become even more difficult. No work is done. Food is also a disaster in Corona. Eating too many problems have arisen. There is also no facility from the government side.PDS ration is not available on time, there is a lot of

problem when late, sometimes you have to stay hungry too.We all think to God the rich that sometimes it will happen that even hungry people will die .

Soni didi, Sanjay Bhaiya has started coming to our village through organization Prayas gramin Vikas samiti .

We are very glad that yah people tell us good things. And today through these we have got rice, flour, pulses, sugar, tea leaves, sugar, salt, soybean, mustard oil, we will be able to eat it for at least a month or two. We are very happy to have got grains today. We thank this institution and its people.

Husband Name - Late Ram Sada Age - 65 years Village - Shahpur , Block - Sattar Katiya, District Saharsa

Savitri Devi is permanent resident of District Saharsa, Her five children. Any son not lets me eat or drink. Sons are Beating, abusing. Had a husband, earned and fed. Home is not the right place to live. There is neither money to build a



house in the rain nor to give foil on that pallet. The disaster came due to corona disease. Earlier he used to work, eat at someone's place but now he is not. Due to Corona, people do not even give work. no any Govt support is not available.

The one who has everything also gets government help. We all are go through a very toughing day when the workers of Prayas Gramin Vikas Samiti come to our village to work on food security. Soni didi we tell people in detail about education, nutrition, health, safety and organization and this is a big thing, by Prayas Gramin Vikas Samiti we give 25 kg rice, 5 kg flour, 5 kg masoor dal, 1 kg Huh. Salt 5 KG 1 KG Mustard oil 1 KG 1 KG Sugar was given, which gave great relief to the poor. Some days you will be able to eat full stomach. We are very happy with the organization.

Right now, ration kit has been given by Prayas Gramin vikas samiti, which includes 25 kg rice, 5 kg flour, 5 kg pulses, 1 kg salt, 1 kg sugar, 5 kg sawdust, 1 kg soybean, 1 kg sugar, 1 kg oil and 500 gm. tea leaves are given.

We will benefit a lot from this ration, as we will not have to sleep hungry now, some days will pass well and now we will be able to eat enough.

Village - Purikh, Panchayat- Purikh, Thana-Bihra, District-Saharsa.

I have two sons. There are 7 families member in total. We don't have land to live on and we are very poor. If we get a work, then we eat, our condition is very bad right now. If you earn daily, you eat, otherwise you have to starve. Ever since Corona came and the lockdown happened. From that day we do not



even get food in our house. Our son used to go to Delhi to earn. They also no longer go to earn in corona time . Corona is pandemic situation has become fatal for our families. There are no laborers in the village. Even after getting the wages, the right wages are not given. Our house is not running well. The government doesn't help either. We have to face many problems.No one comes to see us even from the government's side. For a few days now, the workers of Prayas Gramin Vikas Samiti have come to our village to work on food security, nutrition i.e. right to food. Had a husband, earned and fed. well kept. Both men worked hard and ate happily. Where would that happiness be now? The son abuses and abuses more than the food he gives. I lie in a corner of the house all day long. No one asks for food, even half the stomach is given to food! There is not enough grain left that the whole house can eat enough food every day.

Even if we get food, the bread is thrown to me from afar. It hurts a lot at this age, nothing can be done! We do not get any government facility! Right now some people have started coming to our village through an organization called Prayas Grameen Vikas Samiti, they come and hold meetings and sit and explain to all the people. My sons have also understood this, now my sons do not insult me! Information on health, nutrition, food security is also given in the meeting.
