At present feudal malice and political crimes of various private arms organizations has lead cold blooded war.

Executive summary of the Action

The Poverty Reduction and Food Security, Promoting Social Inclusion of Particularly Marginalized Groups and Increasing Resilience to Disasters in High-Risk Areas . The Project work area is 15 villages of Sattar Kataiya block at Saharsa District. The Project area is approx 35 KM distance in form Saharsa District. Ten Gram Panchayats are selected from these 15 villages. The PGVS team were interact or discus in each villages for our Mission Vision regarding BMZ Globle project.

The PGVS team were discussing with SCs community regarding their issues, Village Development Plan, health and hygiene, Legal Documentation drive, Capacity building, Strengthening of CBO's and all government schemes.

The team members were social maping and Baseline surve completed in 15 villages at Sattar Kataiya Block of BMZ Globle Project Area.

The PGVS team also interacts PRI members and they also support them like Mukhiya, ward members and Panchayat samiti.And Govt. official's members for their supporting like Doctors,ANM,AWW,ASHA,VIKAS MITR, School Teachers Etc.

Activities perform

Food security (nutrition) has been improved by intensive targeting by means of improved access to government programmes.

Right now 400 families are consuming green vegetables continuously due to the Food security (nutrition) has been improved by intensive targeting through its project. Awareness has been brought through food security campaign in all the members (about 15000) of the target area (15 villages) all understand food security, nutrition. Some community members (lumsam 90 persent person) are achieved some government scheme like – ICDS service, PDS Card, MDMscheme & Kichen garden etc. Seeds were distributed to 700 households in two rounds by our project. awareness campaign and distribution of seeds in our project.

This year at least 142SAM/MAM CHILDREN were told about nutrition through the This year at least 136 pregnant and lactating women were told about cleanliness and nutrition through the meeting and 39 pregnant + 97 lactating women were connected to government services (ICDS)through their project. meeting and 22 SAM and 120 MAM CHILDREN were connected to government services (ICDS) through their project.

Regular and reliable quality controls are carried out in the concerted state programme "Poshan Abhiyan" and in the "Public Distribution System" for comprehensive food security.

In addition, campaigns to raise awareness about ways to improve food security at the About 8000 (eight thousand) community members participated in the food security campaign. The campaign included village based food items, green vegetables, fruits, milk and eggs. The sources available from all these food items were displayed through banners. And the properties of all the food items were explained orally. Due to which all the members of the society became aware.community level, village level public campaigns on the theme of social participation of minorities on World Child Deworming Day and International Women's Day, for children with members High-

This year capacity building workshop was organized in which the members of the six committees formed at the Panchayat level, Jeevika Group, Mata Samiti, School Management Committee, Village Health, Cleanliness and Nutrition Committee participated. After getting trained 200 members will be active in their respective committees.

Control bodies, networks, self-help groups and citizens' initiatives (CBOs) acting at community and district level in terms of food security are strengthened.

In the initial phase, PGVS team did not meet any stakeholder at Meso level, but now PGVS team interacted with stakeholders at Meso level and also invited to some program like District level government employee in social audit training as a trainer. Participated in Dalit network meeting, Saharsa District President of Dalit AdhikarManch, District Secretary of Schedule Caste Tribal Cell, Self Help Groups etc.

The nutritional knowledge of particularly disadvantaged families has been improved by providing information on dietary and hygiene habits and government support services.

At the end of this year, the actual numbers of SAM and MAM children are collected and As part of our project work, by engaging in food security campaign, regional meeting, Anganwadi activities, our team noticed that there are many SAM and MAM children in our project area. But I don't have actual numbers/data available at the moment. Because now we have started marking it and the correct answer could not be found in the survey also.

all the children are rehabilitated and then suffer from malnutrition. And at the end of the project all the community members will also be linked to the government schemes.

The social and political participation of Representatives marginalized groups on social problems (beyond food security and disaster prevention) and their use of corresponding government support services in the field of education, welfare and development has increased.

This year fact finding mission activity was done in which 50 people from Vikas Mitra, Anganwadi Didi, Asha Didi, teachers, village society people and our volunteer workers participated. All of us have identified the collective problems arising in the target area like community building, drain-street, Anganwadi center, sub-health center, Homestead land etc. To resolve all the collective problems by forming a committee, contact the concerned department by applying. So far our team has enrolled 46 children in the project area in the high school in which 27 are boys and 19 are girls. **Class 8 – 34 Class 9 – 12**

Through exchanges and cooperation between the various commissions for the protection of minorities provided for in the Constitution (SC Commission, Mahadalit Commission, ST, Women and Minority Commission) and civil society actors, initiatives and networks in the project area, marginalised groups have improved access to government support programmes.

A group has been formed for each village, 15 groups have been formed for fifteen villages in its project area and one group has been formed at the block level, which includes two members from each village, a total group of 30 people at the block level.

Executive summary of the Action

Irrespective of formation of slums in Patna, the lives in slums remain marginalised with respect to access to basic civic amenities, rights and entitlements etc. Our preceding research and field work underlines the economic deprivation, poor health status, meagre land holding, political marginalisation etc. of people of slums. The informal standing of slums becomes a

major roadblock in securing a dignified life for the people. This background understanding makes the basis of this project proposal wherein our focus will be on multiple aspects of their life with a definite aim to improvise them. We propose a blend of short-term, medium-term and long-term activities viz., work on health and education - to develop human capital, capacity building to gain self-sustainable livelihood, formalisation through securing state-given rights and entitlements etc. To attain this goals, we propose to work with the marginalised communities and develop a tailor-made approach developed in-situ with them. An instance of this is the recent organisation of theatre festival with children of slums in Patna. Despite separation in verticals for smooth conduct of our work, we visualise an undergirding philosophy that runs through all of them, i.e., to reduce the gap between different starata of the society and make youth as driver of change.

Activities perform

Physical Identification of Migrant Labourers in Slums of Patna

Collection of Data:- We intend to do a baseline survey of people residing in slums of Patna to identify their source areas and also try to understand if they migrate further in search of dignified work.

Skill Mapping:- We will find what skills are there which can be developed further

Ways and means of benefits of government schemes

Identify the entitlements for migrants and people living in slums: We first need to figure out what are the entitlements for the people of slums especially migrant labour.

Advocacy for Accessibility to government schemes : We will advocate vigorously to get them benefits of the government schemes and other entitlements

Collectivisation of Migrant Laborers:

One Stop Centre: A place where all the migrant laborers will register themselves and report their status of employment and further movement for search of work

Formation of Collectives: Collectives of laborers will be formed with integration of slums of Patna

Development of Mobile App: A mobile application will provide interface with larger market base for unskilled and semi skilled laborers

Community Interface in Slums: Volunteers will work with community in five different slums like educational and cultural activities

Activity Centers in Slums: At least five such centers in five slums will be developed

Years) Khudren Devi permanent resident of Village -Purikh, Panchayat - Purikh, Police Station - Bihra, Block - Sattar Kataiya, District - Saharsa. her comes from Dalit community. This is very poor. They have a small house to live in, in which all the families spend their lives. They have 5 boys and 1 girl. When it rains the whole house gets flooded. The whole family becomes homeless, their husbands also don't go abroad or the state to earn so that they can save some money and

build a small house. Ever since the workers of Prayas Gramin Vikas Samiti in the village used to come to the community to hold meetings related to food security and nutrition, then they also used to participate in that meeting. After taking Aadhaar Card, Ration Card, Pass Book, applied to Vikas Mitra of support of Prayas Worker and after a few days we have got the benefit of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, now we have small building our house with that money in two installments. Received about 80000 eighty thousand rupees, so thanked the worker of prayas Grami Vikas samiti for the effort to get this scheme done

Major learning's

The all project has a Government schemes and Social security Awareness Approach and focuses on enhancing the understanding of all project staffs, volunteers and leaders of DAM for inclusion of Dalits in Social, Economic Spheres of Society. Besides, the project is taking efforts to create an organized structure of DAM from village to state level by formation of Committees of DAM at villages, Panchayats, Blocks, Districts and State levels.

Challenges

- Lack of willingness and livelihood of backlash by the land owning community.
- Mushar community attends meeting or training but if they attend and learn then them loss one day wages so this is effect on their livelihood.
